Trash Overflow? **AUDIT TIME!**

Check your bins to make sure your residents and employees are not contaminating trash with recycling and food scraps; these items have a place of their own.

Encourage residents to set up **Sorting Stations** inside their units to make it easy to place recycling in the blue recycle container and food scraps in the green organics container. Short-Lived Climate Pollutants Law SB 1383 Now in Effect

Across the state, we are working toward a 75% reduction in food and yard waste sent to landfills and a 20% increase in edible food recovery. Organic materials decomposing in the landfill create methane gas. Shifting food scraps and yard waste from the landfill will help put carbon back into the soil to help prevent climate change.

State law requires all residents to collect and place food scraps in their green organics container along with yard trimmings. No plastic bags or compostable to-go ware.

Tips from the Trash Twins

BYOE (Bring Your Own Everything);
carry your own napkin, bottle, utensils, bags and container
for leftovers. Don't pay 25¢ for a single-use cup!

Consider what you are purchasing, how long
it will last, and where the packaging will end up

Recycle clothing and
other items that you're not using, share
with friends with a clothing trade party

Plan a mending party to fix your favorite
outfits and other items

Repurpose things that you can't
recycle to make them new again

Make your own cleaners from
non-toxic everyday products

Replace paper towels and napkins
with washable, reusable cloth

Refill containers instead
of buying new ones
